Family Nursery School

The three classrooms of CCP's Family Nursery School (FNS) are again full with more than 100 children. In addition to a kindergarten, the first class of the primary school has now also started. Going back to school, a good meal and playing nicely, how much they had missed that! The family home now offers a temporary home to some children, who cannot go home. Two young mothers are now taking care of these children. The rest just comes from the neighbourhood of the FNS during the day. Many children now suffer from the flu, but that seems to be going away again. Thanks to a great gift, the three new rooms are now equipped with a ceiling, doors, windows and furniture. Thanks to a donation from the ZWO Bleiswijk, a new toilet was built and a chicken barn, so that the kids can get a fresh egg.

Vocational education

CCP's vocational training courses also suffer from the fact that many students do not return now that it is allowed again. Many parents of the students often have no money to pay the school fees after 2 years of unemployment. As a result, it was not yet possible to pay all teachers their full salary in January. Director Nathan and his staff are busy looking for solutions for this. Check the website to see which courses CCP offers.

A second house in Uganda

Due to Corona, the house project had been halted. In November we were able to officially open 6 houses again. That is always a festive moment. We were able to make a widow, who had just been included in the sponsorship program, happy by making her house burglar-proof. Irene was born in 2015 as the sixth in a family with 2 boys and 6 girls. Irene is in the last year of kindergarten. Her father was killed in a motorcycle accident in 2019. A maternal aunt takes care of the family. The mother tries to earn money as a night watchman, but that is not enough to support the family. The family is very poor. They live in the town of Mbale.



Medi

Medi was born in 2013 as the fifth in a family with 8 children. Medi has 2 brothers and 5 sisters. His father died in 2019 due to a motorcycle accident. After the death of the father, the mother left Medi with an aunt, his father's sister. He now lives with her in Nampanga, Sironko district and attends school there in class P3. The family is very poor and depends on CCP's help.

John

John was born in 2017 as the youngest in a family with 5 children. John has 1 brother and 3 sisters. His father died of a heart failure in 2018. The mother tries to earn some money by working in gardens, but that is not enough to live on since the father has died. John lives in Sironko district and attends school in class P1. The family is very poor and needs help.
