**Highlight 2022**

Personally, I am grateful to God that after 3 months of being ill, I'm completely recovering again. The cause has been found in my thyroid gland and I am now getting the right medications. I can do my work well again. I am grateful that my staff continued the work during my absence. One of the highlights this year for the organization was the renewal of the registration with the government. It took a lot of time (and money), but now we have the necessary permit again to continue our work. Moreover, that is special, because many organizations like ours have been closed down by the government because they did not meet the legal requirements.

**Biggest challenge**

The biggest challenge remains our financial position. This is mainly because the students of our vocational training Institute (VTI) are unable to pay the school fees. End of September, the students had paid only 52% of their school fees. This is partly due to: low turnout of students, drop-outs, poverty as a result of Corona and the high cost of living. We trust that God will also help us through these difficulties. We trust that God will help us through these difficulties as well.

We are happy with the restart of the sewing course after it was been stopped for years due to too little interest. We trained 65 students with a 3 months course and 48 with a 2 years course. This course helps to increase the number of students again.

We pray for enough paying students to run the courses. The cost of equipment, training and exam materials has almost doubled.

We are happy that our children are back at school after the lockdown of 2 years. Counseling the children and homeschooling was difficult and expensive and had too little impact. The reopening of schools has brought life back into our program. Now that they are back in school, it is easier to guide and follow up on the children.

**Biggest challenge**

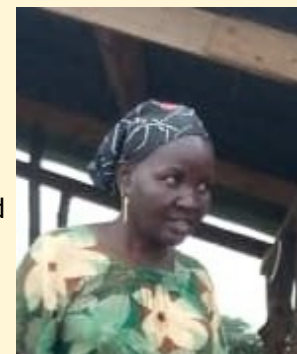
We trust in God that we can continue to give the children what is needed in these difficult days

### We introduce you to:

#### Faith

Faith has been born in 2019 as the second in a family of 4 Childs. Faith has 2 brothers and 1 sister. Faiths father died in May 2020 after short intense disease. Her aunt of her mothers side did take care of Faith. The aunt did take care, but she here self is poor as well is living on a small piece of land which is almost not enough to maintain her own children. Faith lives in Bungokho/Mbale and is over there on the St. Peter's Nursery school.

#### Elijah

Elijah has been born in 2017 as the second with a family of 2 children. He has one brother and is an orphan fully. Elijah 's father died in 2016 after a crash on a motor bike. Till then they lived in Kampala. The family moved to Mbale where his mother died in 2020 , Corona might be the cause. His aunt of the side of his mother takes care for Elijah. The aunt did take care for the children, but she is poor herself and is living from small activities and banana sales, hardly enough to take care of her own children. She has no home of her self . Elijah lives in Mbale and goes to Mayor primary school

#### Paul

Paul has been born in 2017 as the 3th in a family of 4 children. He has 1 sister and 2 brothers. Paul's father died in 2018 due to a motor cycle accident. Paul's grand father and mother try to take care but are quite poor and no source of income. Also they are old and sickly and are living in an environment with regular floddings. They urgently need help. Paul lives in Bumbodi Mbale District and attends the Bukhumwa primary school in the first class
