The main purpose of such a visit is: meeting new sponsored children (see photo), visit goat groups, open new houses, visit the Mountain View house and schools, go to the agricultural project and of course a lot of meetings.



New name on the technical school

The technical school, which was founded and maintained by the Hans van Bokkem Foundation, was given a new name and new logo after the death of founder Anneke Luyt. From now on, the foundation will be called the 'Hans and Anneke foundation'. Anneke's two sisters and brother visited CCP together with their partners. All 6 of them planted a tree in memory of Anneke. Chair Heleen Luyt acted as a guest of honour during the annual graduation.

The CCP Mountain View House

The house that serves as crisis and emergency shelter for CCP has now been given a name: The Mountain View House! At the moment there are 35(!) children staying there, even though they have to sleep with two in one bed. Here are a few stories:

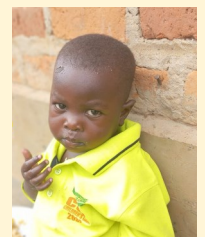


* Peace and Ronny lost their mother shortly after their father and are now being cared for in the Mountain View home. They come from a family with alcohol problems. On the photo, they are standing at the grave of their parents.

* Little Alice (picture right) was born in prison and brought back to her family. CCP visited the family and found Alice neglected and malnourished. She is now the youngest resident of the Mountain View House.



* Hinonya broke his leg in an accident and was taken to the witch doctor by his grandmother. CCP's social workers learned of the accident and searched for Hinonya for a week and found him at the witchdoctor's house. They took him to the hospital for treatment. Now he's staying at the Mountain View house. Other kids stay there to heal from severe malaria and other health problems! We are so grateful and happy with this Mountain View home!! In addition to the Mountain View house, CCP also has a nursery (kindergarten) school for our own children and children from the area. The three classrooms are used intensively and plans to expand with a primary school are being worked out. Talks are ongoing with the Hans and Anneke Foundation to possibly turn it into a second 'Hans and Anneke school' !

"Look, this is where I live", Elvix welcomes me into the house where he has been living with his grandmother since the loss of his father and mother. The cottage looks very shabby. Grandma has HIV and Elvix is also HIV positive. That is why we are so keen to help tackle the shabby house they now live in. In the meantime, the Gideonschool in Nieuwerkerk aan den IJssel has started a campaign to save money for a new house for Elvix. Bravo!! Jemina and her sister Whitney are also on the waiting list of the house project together with

their mother. After her husband's suicide, the mother (HIV) is struggling with major problems, including no home to live in. If you have a wedding, anniversary or birthday to celebrate, think about spending the money on a cottage for a widow in need! The waiting list is long enough. For €3,000 you can make a difference! Something to celebrate?

There are plenty of large and small CCP projects:

- 40 new computers for the school (€150/pc.)
- Ceilings in the 3 kindergarten classrooms (€3,000)
- Start of CCP hair fashion shop for practice students and source of income for the school (€7,500)
- A house for a widow (€3,000)
- Set-up of a coffee corner from the catering training (€10,000)

Give a goat!

Under this name, we have been raising funds for our IGA (Income Generating Activities) project for a number of years. This year, for example, 47 widows received two pregnant goats.

We let one of them, *Tom's mother (sponsor child)*, speak: "I have only recently become a very sad widow. My husband's family wants me to remarry so they can own the house I live in now. They also want me to leave the children with my husband's family. I don't want to think about doing this! I am under a lot of emotional and financial pressure." This widow received 2 goats from CCP through the goat project



What a godsend for her. She now has an income and is not dependent on her husband's family. The goats are pregnant and will have little ones very quickly. In the picture the handing out of goats. Never known that two goats could be so important in the life of a widow?

Inflation and increase of costs

In Uganda, too, we notice that everything is getting more expensive. Because there, too, the cost of food and fuel is rising. Our social work is struggling to make ends meet and has had to work under financial stress for years. Other sponsoring organizations in the Netherlands have increased the sponsorship contribution for some time now. After more than 10 years, it is high time for us to adjust our sponsorship contribution a bit to inflation. CCP owes its existence and is supported by our sponsors. That's why we can never be grateful enough to you. Because it can be difficult for some to increase the sponsorship contribution, especially at this time, we want to implement it as an option/voluntary increase for the time being. In short: if possible, we would like to **increase the monthly contribution per child to €33 from January 2024**. You can adjust your contribution yourself. If you can't miss the extra €4,= at the moment, you can leave the amount at €29 per child for the time being.
